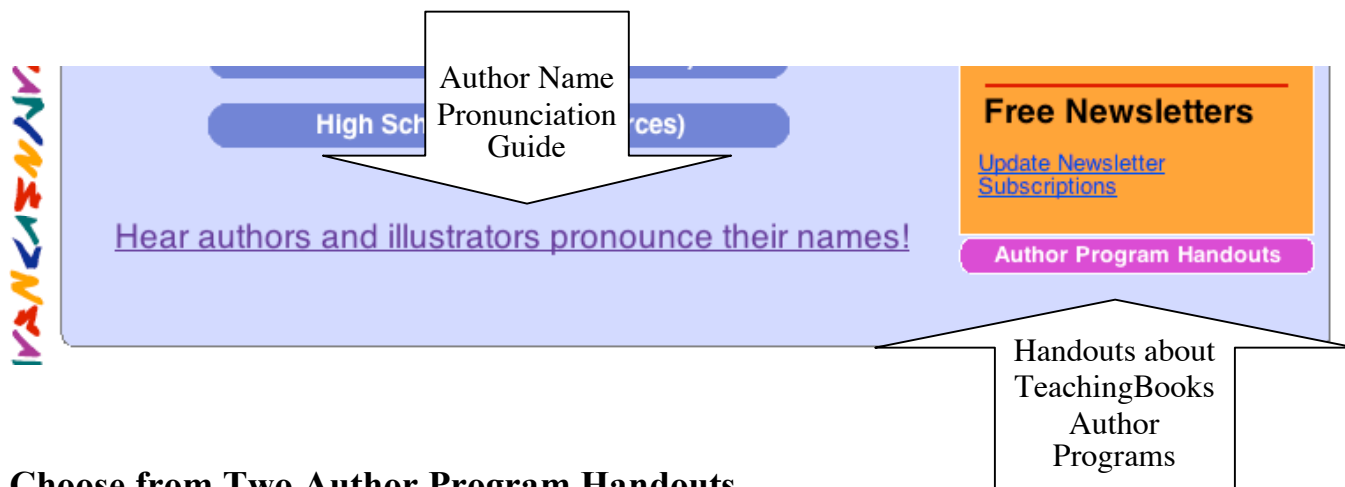
Bring Authors' Voices to Students with our Author Name Pronunciation Guide
