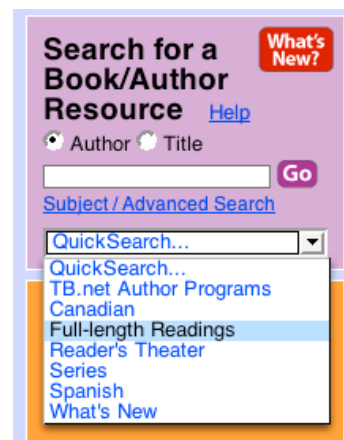


Full-length Book Readings Easily Accessible

Since last year, TeachingBooks has doubled the number of Book Readings available for you to share with your students. Here’s a summary about the Book Readings section:

- Most of the 2,000 Book Readings are just *excerpts* of the book being read aloud. These give students a taste of what the book will be like as they hear the pacing, accent, or rhythm of a book.
- About 140 Book Readings have the *entire* book — often a picture book — being read aloud. These sometimes include video or animation that accompany the audio reading.
- To find the full-length Book Readings, follow these simple steps:
 - 1) Go to the purple search box in the upper, right-hand corner of the TeachingBooks website.
 - 2) Click on the pull-down menu labeled “QuickSearch.”
 - 3) Select the third option, labeled “Full-length Readings.”

Drop down to the option for
“Full-length Readings.”
