If you enter the site via...	you'll access:
http://TeachingBooks.net	the home page with a free trial offer
http://TeachingBooks.net/home	the home page with a place to sign in
your shared password only (no email address)	the main area (4 most-used areas of the site)
an IP authenticated school *	the main area (4 most-used areas of the site)
your work email address only (no password) *	the main area (4 most-used areas of the site)
your previously registered email address and personal password	the Educator Area (all 6 areas of the site, plus newsletters and customized updates)
