





Teach Students About Letters

- Do a keyword search for "alpha" to get the alphabet book results.




Teach Students About Word Sounds

- Students will learn new words and gain confidence with the words they already know.




Students Can Hear English Being Spoken

- Students are able to hear books read in English and learn the correct pronunciation.



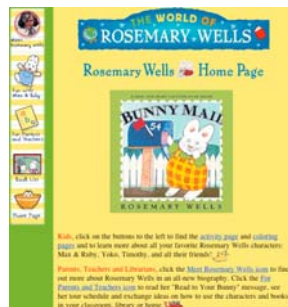
Students Can Get Homework Help
