


Rebekkah's Journey

In *Rebekkah's Journey*, Mama brought a very small bundle with her for the journey to America. She did bring two of Papa's shirts, and her wedding picture.




Rebekkah's papa had been captured by the Nazis during World War II.

Why is the statue still important to all Americans?


SAIL TO AMERICA
