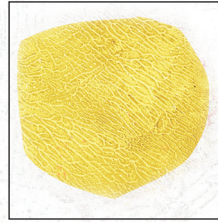

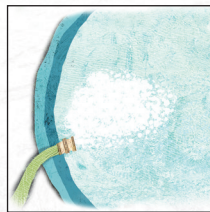

Backyard Fun

It's a perfect day for some fun outdoor activities. Here are some suggestions for things you can do in your own backyard—no matter the size!



- Create a nature scavenger hunt. Make a list of things to look for—leaves, insects, etc.—and then start hunting!
- Have a picnic! It will be nice to be outside, but also close to home in case you forget the mustard.
- Search for cool rocks, and then paint and decorate what you find.
- Grab some old white t-shirts and pillowcases and have a tie-dye party.
- Play a game of outdoor Twister. Either use the traditional game, or create your own with spray paint in the grass!
- Plant a garden. You can try out vegetables, flowers, or herbs depending on how much space you have!
- Do you have more concrete than grass in your backyard? Find some sidewalk chalk and create a mural or set up a game of hopscotch.

Squirrel, Squirrel, Bear!

Get outside and enjoy the perfect day!
Grab a group of family and friends to play “Squirrel, Squirrel, Bear!”



How to Play:

This is just like Duck, Duck, Goose . . . only more perfect!

- Players sit in a circle with one player (“It”) on the outside.
- The player who is “It” walks around the circle, tapping or pointing to each player in turn and calling each a “Squirrel” until finally calling one a “Bear.”
- The “Bear” then gets up and chases “It” around the circle and tries to tag “It”, while “It” tries to get back to the spot where “Bear” had been sitting.
- If “It” reaches the seat before being tagged by “Bear,” then “Bear” becomes “It” and the game starts over again.
- If “Bear” tags “It,” then “Bear” goes back to the original spot in the circle and “It” tries again.
