DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: (Please include 4-6 questions)

- 1 What secrets do you think cats might have?
- 2 How would you keep other animals from reading the book of cat secrets?
- 3 Which character(s) do you like most in the book the cats or the mouse? Why?
- 4 What secrets would you find in a book called Human Secrets?
- 5 The cats in this book talk to the reader. They ask questions. They ask the readers to do things, and they act like they are getting answers. What do you think of that? Do you talk to your cat? Do you wait for them to respond?
- 6 What do you think the mouse in the story will do with the cat secrets he learns?

ACTIVITIES with CORE STANDARDS:

Language Arts: Kindergarten Core Standard #2: Find the title and author of a text. Use pictures and text to draw conclusions and answer who, what and where questions.

- Put the book on the Dukane digital presenter and project the cover on the screen.
- Ask a student to come up and point to the title and then have another student locate the author's name on the cover.
- Discuss the picture on the cover and what "shhh!" might mean in the story.
- Take a picture walk through the book and discuss what might happen in the story.
- Read the book aloud and discuss speech bubble technique.
- Discuss onomatopoeia and the words in the book that are onomatopoeias. List on board.
- Ask the students who, what and where questions following the reading to check comprehension.

Language Arts:

Retell this story with the characters being another animal – a dog, a horse, a snake, whatever animal you choose. What do these animals say and ask?

- 1.RL.1 Ask and answer questions about key details in a text.
- 1.RL.2 Retell stories, including key details, and demonstrate understanding of their central message or lessons.
- 1.RL.3 Describe characters, settings, and major events in a story, using key details.

Science:

Kindergarten Core Standard #5: Examine and classify living and nonliving organisms in order to compare and contrast their characteristics. Observe plants and animals and describe their similarities and differences.

- Show class photos of living and nonliving things. Ask them to sort them into living and nonliving baskets.
- Discuss characteristics of the items/photos in each basket.
- Focus on animals. What characteristics do animals have?
- Read the book aloud. After reading it, name anything that is living or nonliving in the story.
- The book and cats are the main living/nonliving items in the story. Do a Venn diagram together comparing the characteristics of a book and cat. Analyze to see if there are any common characteristics.
