LESSON 1

- 1. This story is set in London, England.
- 2. Mrs. May lived in India when she was a child.
- 3. Pod is upset because a boy saw him.
- 4. Emigrate means to leave one's own country to settle in another.

- 6. The lights in Aunt Sophy's house were different than lights are today because hers used gas instead of electricity.

LESSON 2

- 1. The Borrowers were given that name because they borrow things from humans to live.
